The Vermont Environmental Board hereby issues Land Use Permit #3W0370-2-EB pursuant to the authority vested in it by 10 V.S.A. §§6001-6092 (Act 250). This permit applies to the lands identified in Book 39, Pages 184 – 187 of the land records of the Town of Royalton, Vermont, as the subject of a deed to Henry Kober, the president of Design Contempo, Inc.

This permit specifically authorizes the previous installation of a 15, 000 gallon underground fuel tank with pumps, the construction of enclosures for a debarker room and a generator, and hours of operation for the said generator (Project). The Project is located off Waterman Road, Route #22, in the Town of Royalton.

The Permittee, its assigns, and successors in interest, are obliged by this permit to complete, operate, and maintain the Project in accordance with the following conditions:

- 1. The Permittee shall complete, operate and maintain the project in accordance with: (a) the terms and conditions of Land Use Permit #3W0370-2 issued by the District 3 Environmental Commission on August 3, 2000, except as amended hereby; (b) *Re: Design Contempo, Inc.,* #3W0370-2-EB, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order, issued on even date herewith, (c) the plans and exhibits on file with the Commission; and (d) the conditions of this permit. The Permittee shall not make any changes to the Project without the written approval of the District 3 Environmental Commission.
- 2. The Permitee shall enclose the debarker room located on the sawmill premises as provided by the Department of Labor and Industry, L&I File no. 50268, authorization #742469 (October 17, 2000), and as described in *Re: Design Contempo, Inc.,* #3W0370-2-EB, Finding of Fact 7.
- 3. The Permittee shall enclose the generator located on the premises as described in *Re: Design Contempo, Inc.*, #3W0370-2-EB, Finding of Fact 8.

- 4. Weekday operating hours of the generator shall be restricted to 6:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- 5. In addition to weekday operating hours, the Permittee may operate the generator an additional 525 hours annually provided that: (a) the hours of additional operation shall be conducted only between 4:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on weekdays, and between 6:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Saturdays; and (b) the additional hours are to be used for emergency or reasonable business necessities including, but not limited to the maintenance and mill repairs, making up for lost time, meeting customer needs and rush orders, and processing an oversupply of wood.
